What to expect on trip: Come and join Hand-In-Hand Early Years Nature Education Program's director Jarrett Krentzel for a close look at Cumberland's Nature Education Program designed to offer a unique natural learning experience for children aged 3-5 years. Observe the SEEDS program (3-4 year olds) while they explore, interact and learn as they play outside and discover what they love about our local forest. There will be time for observation, presentation, discussion and question and answer. A portable toilet is available.
