The Deep Bay Marine Field Station supports both pure and applied coastal and marine research activities related to: sustainable shellfish aquaculture development; preservation of coastal ecosystems; and inter-disciplinary projects involving local communities. We also open up the Field Station to the public so that we can educate about important issues related to sustainability of coastal communities.



We are located on Vancouver Island in the historic fishing community of Deep Bay, at the South end of Baynes Sound, now known for a thriving shellfish farming industry and rural community. The Field Station is a 1230 m² multi-use facility with purpose built venues in a flexible design. Special purpose rooms include a seminar/teaching room and an adjoining interpretive foyer/demonstration kitchen on the upper floor. The lower floor includes a teaching classroom and wet and dry research laboratories. Other Facilities include a working shellfish farm on nearby deep water and intertidal tenure and in the future a research tank farm on site. The innovative programming at the field station utilizes all of these facilities/venues singly or in various combinations.

Come visit the Deep Bay Marine Field Station! This unique green research facility has been designed to host a wide variety of public activities including guided and self-guided tours, school groups, meetings, conferences and small or large catered events.
